“Okinawa is a new global center of tourism, according to a recent report in the magazine *World Touring Today*. In 2012 Okinawa attracted an impressive six million tourists but by 2015 this figure had jumped to just under eight million. Tourists say they want to visit Okinawa because they want to enjoy its natural beauty and warm, subtropical climate.

Okinawa Prefecture’s Minister of Tourism and Hospitality, Kazuki Hamagawa, announced yesterday that this news is very positive. “However, there are still some problems regarding tourism in Okinawa that we—and the central government in Tokyo—need to look at closely,” he said.

For example, a recent survey shows some surprising facts and opinions. It’s true that more and more people are coming to Okinawa, but many tourists and also local residents said they were worried about the following: (1) too much development, which damages the natural beauty of the island and marine life; (2) many U.S. bases on the island; (3) problems caused by overcrowding, such as the large amount of trash created by the extra tourists.

For these reasons, Mr. Hamagawa believes that the government in Tokyo should seriously think about its policies of development in Okinawa. At the moment, more people are coming to Okinawa to see the natural beauty of the island. However, if development continues at this pace, the

natural beauty will disappear. This could mean that, 20 years from now, Okinawa will have neither a beautiful environment nor a healthy tourism industry. It is true that now there is more money coming into Okinawa due to tourism, but if policies stay the same, this will not last forever.

What is also interesting is where the tourists come from. The vast majority, over six million, still come from mainland Japan, but there has also been a dramatic increase in the number of foreign tourists. In just one year, the number of overseas visitors has risen by 69%, reaching 1,670,300 in 2015. The greatest number of these, around half a million, came from Taiwan. Second, third, and fourth place were taken by China, Korea, and Hong Kong, respectively.

The trend over the past few years seems to show that Okinawa will remain a very popular destination for world travelers keen to enjoy the island’s natural surroundings. “The real challenge,” states Mr. Hamagawa, “is for the people of Okinawa to think of some way to preserve the natural beauty that is so attractive.”

Dr. Junko Waseda, professor of environmental science at Chubu University, agreed with Mr. Hamagawa. “He makes a good point,” she said. “Of course people want to make money in this tourist boom, but we must not forget what makes Okinawa special.”

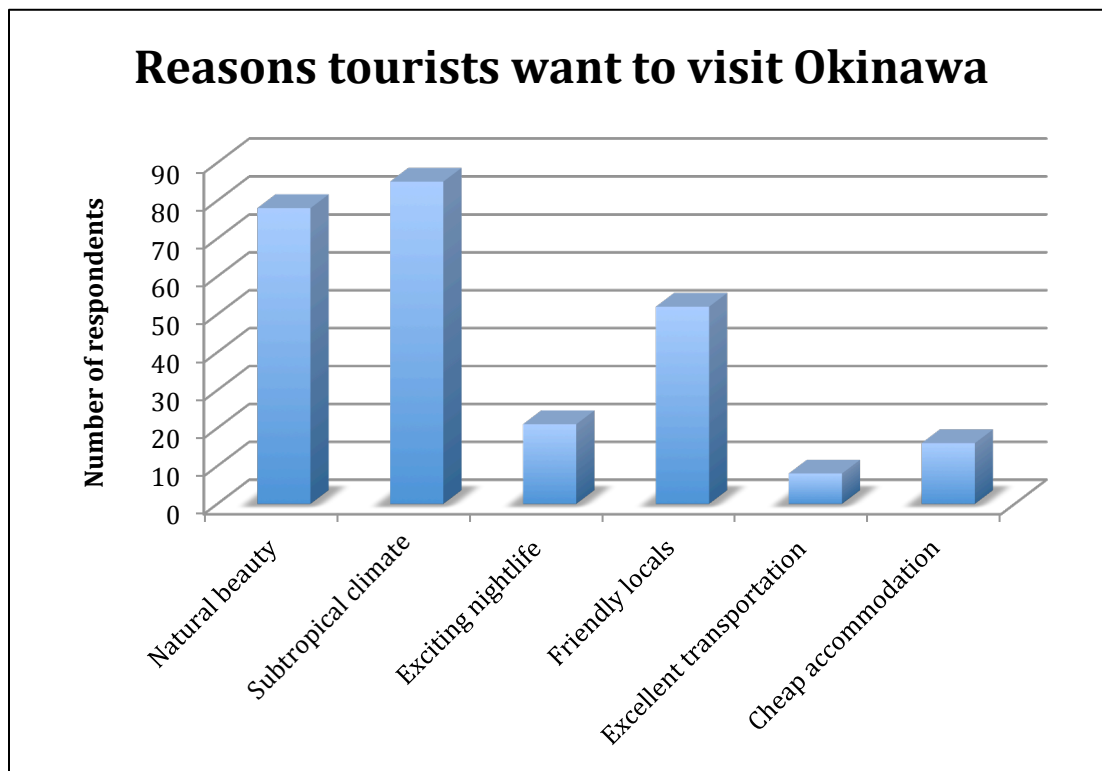

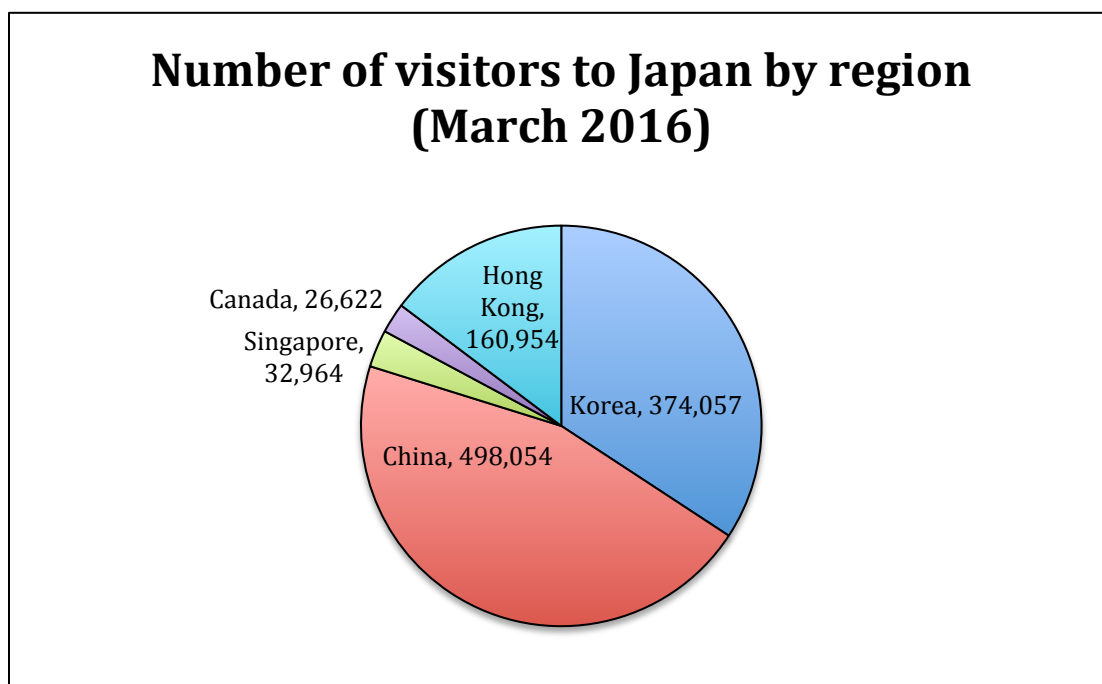

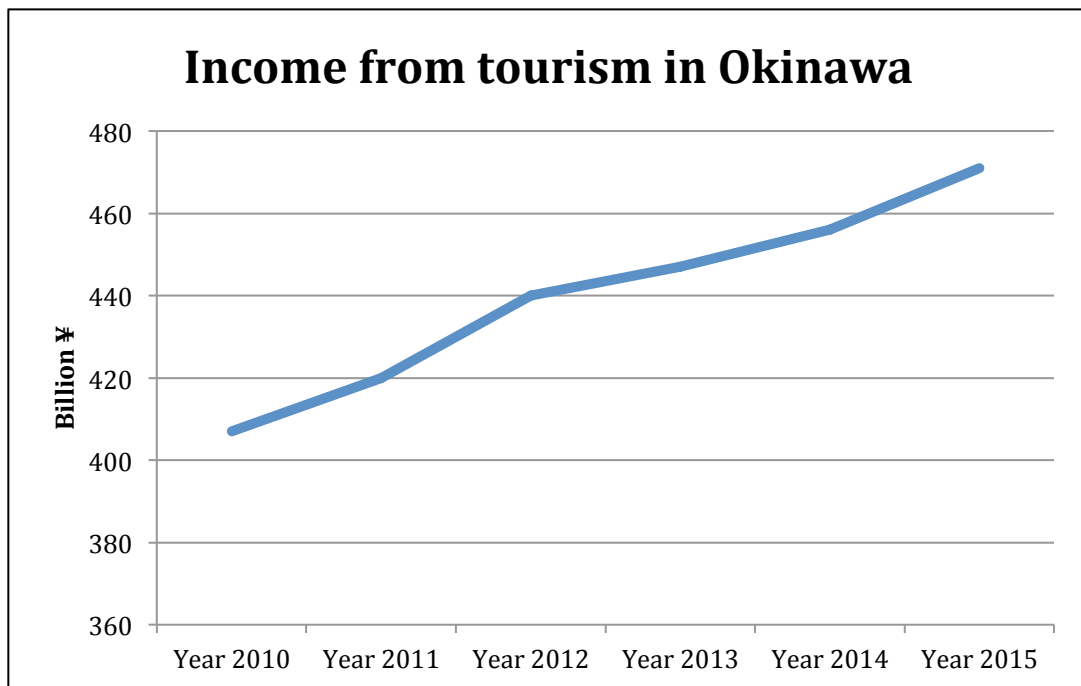
