There was an unusually large number of earthquakes around the world in 1999. There were three big ones in Turkey, and one each in Greece, Taiwan, Mexico and California.

The first earthquake in Turkey happened in August and caused a lot of damage.

As soon as it happened, rescue workers from many countries rushed to Turkey to help. But when they arrived, the situation was very disorganized. The Turkish government did not give them any instructions. They had to decide themselves where to go and who to help. If the Turkish government had been better organized, perhaps fewer people would have died.

Another reason why this earthquake was such a disaster was that many buildings were weak. Before the earthquake, houses had been cheap to buy but this was because the building materials were not of good quality. Some of the concrete, for example, contained too much sand. This made the concrete so weak that it <u>crumbled</u> in one's hand. By using cheap materials the builders were able to make big profits and become rich. When people bought an inexpensive new apartment or house, they did not realize that it would probably be destroyed if there was an earthquake.

Over 15,000 people died in the first Turkish earthquake and many more were injured, or went <u>missing</u>. It is not surprising that after the earthquake some of the builders went into hiding. Others were arrested by the police.

There will always be strong earthquakes like the ones in Turkey. However, this natural disaster was made worse by bad planning and people's greed.
