She is now 61 years old and retired after 40 years of being a care worker. I am so proud of her, and I am proud to be her daughter.

When I make a big decision, she always encourages me and gives me confidence. The most unforgettable moment for me was when I decided to go to America for the first time to join a summer program at the age of 14. My neighbors asked my mom, "How could you allow such a young girl to go abroad?" At the time, it was unusual for middle school students to go abroad. Then my mom answered, "I'm worried a little bit, but I just want her to experience whatever she wants". Her words made me feel so loved because she believed in me. When my mom was my age now, she never thought about going abroad. Thanks to her encouragement, I was able to see the world that my mom never got to see and those experiences have made me who I am.

Even now she still encourages me. A couple of weeks ago, when I decided to apply for this contest, I couldn't decide what to talk about. I was totally panicking, but then my mom came into my room with a cup of my favorite honey citrus tea and said "You don't have to think too much, just follow your heart" At that moment, I made up my mind about what I was going to talk about today.

Today I'd like to take this opportunity to remind you not to take your mom for granted. Today when you go back home, try to spend time with your mom. It's okay even if you don't have many things to say; maybe you can ask her how her day was like. You'll be surprised she is still working so hard for you.
