<p>研究分野</p>	<p>As studies of rhetoric have expanded beyond the artful use of oratory and discursive signs, my interest in organized persuasive communication has expanded to symbols, sounds, colors, and images. Interest in tools, techniques and signs of persuasion and coercion developed when I began noticing in the 1990s patterns of manipulation and deception in mainstream media and the effects that framing had on the public's perception of threats to nations, communities, and civil rights. My work integrates research in linguistics, psychology, and communication theory to describe ways in which power centers organize and carry out campaigns of mass persuasion and engineer consent for policies and actions across cultures. The effort is aimed at stimulating exploration of the following kinds of questions: to what extent can disinterested observers understand public discourse as part of a larger experiment in which dominant social, political, and economic forces shape perception to influence opinion? Can the observer extrapolate meaningful data from public opinion that verifies the conditions of the experiment, who the experimenters are, the subjects, and the control groups? Can the observer describe the precise mechanisms that work to shape perception and opinion?</p>
