In case a blackout occurs due to a typhoon and it is difficult to hold classes, makeup classes will be scheduled on the alternative dates: Saturday, August 12th and/or Sunday, August13th.

7. Eligibility: Proficiency in both Japanese and English.

It is desirable for students in the Basic Level to possess English ability equivalent to STEP (EIKEN) Pre-2 or higher and those in the Advanced Level STEP (EIKEN) Pre-1 or higher.

8. Course Description: Effective training, which is grounded in fundamental theories of communication, is necessary for developing interpreters. In addition to linguistic elements, students will also come to understand the importance of nonverbal factors with the goal of acquiring communication skills facilitating a "total performance." Through practical lessons, this short intensive course aims to improve participants' level of language proficiency in both Japanese and English as well as enable them to acquire the

capability to present accurately and effectively. The course has produced numerous outstanding interpreters. This year, a curriculum has been adopted which aims to further raise the level of instruction and takes into consideration the practical realities of interpreting in Okinawa.

Practical instruction will be given in several areas of interpreting, such as basic court interpretation, for which demand has risen in recent years.

9. Method of Instruction: Language laboratories specifically designed for simultaneous interpretation will be used. Students will strengthen their basic proficiency in Japanese and English through practice shadowing the original language of broadcast television news and videos in both English and Japanese as well as by taking notes while they acquire a better understanding of the content of such programs.

In addition, each and every student will have the opportunity to stand at a microphone and interpret consecutively in front of the class. These sessions will be analyzed and evaluated. The goal is to prompt a change in behavior by allowing the students to become more aware of their own performance. Instructors will provide guidance, using dynamic teaching methods based on theoretical fundamentals. Even first-time students will realize significant improvement in both their English and Japanese communication skills by the end of the course.

Moreover, students in the Advanced Level will learn skills and knowledge which will prove to be immediately effective. Such acquisition will be gained as students actually provide interpretation for lectures as well as experience court interpretation in a mock trial setting.

Please note that we will immediately move to online (zoom) lectures when/if the classes are not able to meet due to a Typhoon.

11. Enrollment Process:
